People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

By your will they were created and have their being.

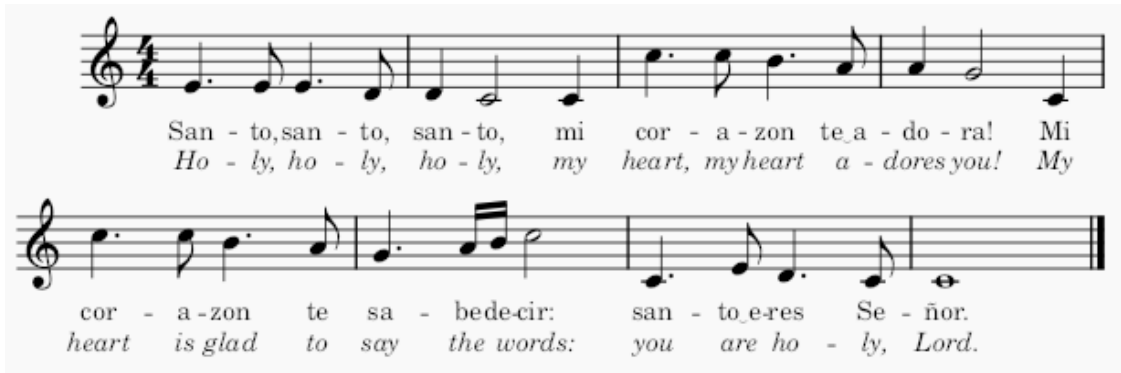

All Saints' Day involves reflecting on the communion of saints, the faithful in heaven and on earth, and the memory of those who have died, often inspiring prayers for an abundance of God's reconciliation and a spirit of shared purpose in faith. It is a day for remembering the past, finding hope for the future, and recognizing the enduring love and presence of God through the "cloud of witnesses".

Themes and thoughts on them

The Communion of Saints:

The day celebrates all those who have lived faithful lives, creating a spiritual connection between the living and those who have passed on.

A Cloud of Witnesses:

The faithful are often described as a "cloud of witnesses," a spiritual community that encourages and supports those on earth in their journey of faith.

Memory and Hope:

All Saints' Day serves as a time to remember loved ones who have died, find solace in shared grief, and look forward to a future with them in God's presence.

Spiritual Unity:

A central theme is the unity of all people in Christ, recognizing that "All are one in thee, for all are thine".

Intercessory Prayer:

Prayers are offered to God for the prayers of the saints, asking for an abundance of God's reconciliation and peace.

Prayer and Reflection:

Many people use this day for prayer, reflection, and contemplating the lives of the saints.

Singing Hymns:

Hymns like "For All the Saints" or "How Bright These Glorious Spirits Shine" are often sung to honor the saints and their faith.

Remembering the Departed:

It is a time to acknowledge and give thanks for the lives of those who are no longer with us, finding strength in their memory.

Why do we renew our baptismal vows?

We renew baptismal vows to personally affirm the promises made on our behalf during infant baptisms, to recommit to our faith and allegiances, and to reaffirm our identity as members of Christ's Church. This act of renewal strengthens individuals' resolve to live out their baptismal calling, reject evil, and participate more fully in the Christian life.

- **Personal Commitment:**

Many people are baptized as infants and do not remember making the promises. Adults renew their vows to make them their own, choosing to pick up the mantle passed down by their parents and godparents.

- **Recommitting to Faith:**

The renewal is a communal and personal recommitment to God and the faith community. It is an affirmation of allegiance to Christ and the rejection of all that is evil.

- **Strengthening Resolve:**

The act helps to reorder one's heart, mind, and soul, strengthening their resolve to live out their faith and be Christ-like in the world.

- **Connecting to the Sacraments:**

Renewing vows at Easter, particularly the Easter Vigil, connects the faithful to the "Paschal Mystery," recalling how they have been buried with Christ in Baptism to rise to new life.

- **Public Witness:**

It is an opportunity to publicly and openly profess one's faith and commitment to Christ and His Church.

- **Understanding One's Identity:**

The renewal serves as a powerful reminder of the identity and privileges received in Baptism, a reminder that one is a beloved child of God, reborn in Christ.

Answer to baptismal renewal question: *Easter Vigil; Day of Pentecost; Baptism of our Lord (First Sunday after the Epiphany). Bonus: Whenever the Bishop comes for their Visitation. BCP, page 312 (under Additional Directions)*

We ask that those worshipping with us online reverently pray and meditate on God's grace and blessing whenever you observe the Eucharist being taken.
